

PLEASE TAKE TIME TO READ THIS IMPORTANT NEWSFLASH IF YOU ARE CROSSING THE BORDER AT LEBOMBO/RESSANO GARCIA DURING THE EASTER HOLIDAY PERIOD AS IT CONTAINS ESSENTIAL INFORMATION WHICH WILL MAKE YOUR TRAVELS EASIER

It is a pleasure for MCLI to inform our readers that the Lebombo / Ressano Garcia Border Posts will be operating 24 hours from today 25 March 2013 up to 14 April 2013.

Please note that this period carries the highest volume of holiday, business and tourist travel and due to the volumes, limitations of infrastructure and human resources, queues and congestion are expected over the peak days, so travellers are requested to be patient, and to prepare for this eventuality.



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The 2013 Onderberg Species Invitational Bonanza with Angling & Outdoor World.

Entering the tropical paradise as you travel north, approximately 100km out of Maputo, you are overwhelmed by the beauty and water resources of Mozambique. Full of anticipation, we were ready to take part in the 2013 edition of the annual Onderberg Specie Bonanza after being well kitted out with tackle and gear from Angling & Outdoor World. The event is held annually in Barra, Mozambique.

Having arrived on the Friday, and the opening ceremony of the event only being on the Sunday evening, the team (consisting of Peter Zonneveld, owner of Angling & Outdoor World Nelspruit, Michael Cronje, Angling & Outdoor World Representative, Andre Henn, founder and CEO of ASFN – Advanced Sports Fishing Network, camera operator, Christiaan and myself, Carolien) had sufficient time to settle into our accommodation at Anda Ca Lodge.

Anda Ca Lodge is situated right on the beach, with coconut trees forming a canopy at the entrance. With such a setting you are content in the fact that you have just entered a pristine paradise. Warmly received by the Anda Ca Lodge owners, Nick and Martha and the hospitable staff, we immediately felt right at home. Our accommodation for the next week would be a wooden house right on the unspoiled beach. The Angling & Outdoor World boat was parked right at the front door, so to speak, which made loading, fuel changes and everything else easy as pie. After settling in to the open-plan accommodation, which is seriously roomy and boasts sleeping place for up to 10 people, we headed out to meet up with some of the anglers taking part in the Bonanza. We were warmly welcomed by our fellow fisher folk and the first night saw most of the participants letting their hair down after the long journey, not to mention the many laborious hours spent at the border! Socializing and meeting up with the other anglers fishing the competition is always a special way to kick off an event of this nature.

On Sunday afternoon the skippers meeting set the mood for the competition and all the teams arrived in good cheer and spirit. Safety regulations and a briefing on the schedule for the next four angling days were conveyed to the fishermen and women. Each boat received a comprehensive angling pack including Onderberg Bonanza drinking glasses, an emergency kit, fishing shirts, key holders and more, all contributed by the sponsors of this great event. Ahead of the first day on the sea, a much needed early night was had by most anglers after the briefing ended.

Monday morning and just before day break, the eager crews lined the beach ready for launching. With a dynamic beach control team launching was a breeze. Onto the open sea the boats sped away. Show time had arrived and each boat now had to hold its own and implement the well meditated strategy for the day. Team Angling and Outdoor World made a bee line south towards Tofina putting out a tasty spread of Williamson lures and Rapalas for King Mackerel, Tuna and the odd billfish that's around this time of year.

With the spread out and the crew discussing the game plan, the calm turned into adrenalin fueled madness as a Sailfish leapt into the air performing a series of acrobatic jumps behind the Ace Glider. Fish on! This is the first fish hooked for the tournament and a beautiful Sailfish at that. Nominated for the first catch, it feels like the sides of my mouth are going to shred as I can't contain the smile and joy of finally having the opportunity to hook into a Sailfish. Skipper Peter quickly radios beach control for the unique hand signal for the photograph and on receipt photos are quickly taken while Andre has a grip on the bill. A couple of snap shots are taken on the boat and now the best part of catching any fish presents itself. The release. The boat is put into gear and we take our time to make sure that this gracious specimen is completely revived and kicking before we bid our final farewells.

The remainder of the day progressed slowly. Michael and Peter both boated a King Mackerel a piece and Andre managed to raise three different Trevally species on jigs. All of which were released. I hook into two sharks whilst jigging, both of which bit me off after lengthy battles. Only pelagics of over 4kg are weighable. The total weight of your catches multiplied by the number of species you weighed amounts to your total score for the day. Not many big fish were weighed during the first day. A couple of boats caught multiple species moving them up into overall contention on the scoreboard. Our released Sailfish bagged us a solid 15 points. Despite the slow start, we did all manage to land ourselves a "strafdop" that night.



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The following two days were once again a treat on the water. With perfect angling conditions and good company we managed to get a variety of fish, but out of the full two days only a King Mackerel caught by Michael, and a Greater Barracuda caught by myself managed to make the cut. In the afternoon at weigh-in the sprits where high and the drinks where again flying. Good conversations and great people.

The owners of Anda Ca Lodge specially opened a separate bar for the participants on Wednesday night to come and join us so we could talk about our individual brands (Angling and Outdoor World, ASFN and SACRAA) and of course allow the participants to experience the great service they can expect at Anda Ca Lodge.

The final day of fishing arrived sooner than most anglers preferred, and after a momentous night it was quite difficult to get up and out for the last day of the Onderberg Specie Bonanza. We decided to start out deep and it wasn't long before Peter got me hooked into a decent size Yellowfin Tuna. Before long, Michael also had a swift tussle with a weighable Tuna. After those two fish it all went quiet for us and we resorted to chasing birds around, rewardlessly casting lures into balls of baitfish being munched by the ensuing Tuna. The most excitement we had was watching a fellow boat, Fatikaki, hook into a Marlin that was so close it nearly leapt into our boat. Some of the chaps on neighbouring vessels decided to start the party early while cruising around a well known reef called Rainbow.

The big night had arrived and it was time to separate the men from the not-feeling-so-manly at prize giving. Some excellent catches were had during the four days and the expectation was high as anglers speculated who would walk away with what.

As is customary at the Bonanza, at every weigh-in "strafdoppe" are awarded for noteworthy incidents, but one incident in particular comes to mind that our Skipper, Peter, never received a "dop" for. That was rectified at prize giving as he was awarded the biggest "strafdop" for the tournament, a bottle of Rum and Brandy, for the quick pit stop we had to do with the boat right in front of our chalet to get extra fuel after we ran out mid morning.

On a more significant note, Team Angling and Outdoor World and ASFN received the prize for first fish of the tournament. I was awarded the prize for biggest Tuna of the tournament and 2nd place overall in the ladies category. First prize in this class went to Lisa from the boat Peri Peri.

The highest honour of all went to Johmar who took the overall win with a massive points tally of 470.4. Second placed Fujimo ended 259.8 points behind the winners on 210.6. Third place went to Sail la Vie who managed 162.6 points. Congratulations to everyone who participated and well done on your wonderful team spirit and camaraderie.


