TOURNAMENT BRIEFING

At NHONGUANE LODGE on the 5th May 2019 at 15H00 sharp. Attendance is compulsory.

THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE THESE TIMES.

GENERAL

IGFA rules and standards apply. **Boats found contravening any of these rules can be disqualified for the Day.** Games fish only, no bottoms!! And no sharks!! No FAD's. NO JIGGING AND NO DROP SHOTTING.

LINE CLASS AND TESTING

10KG ONLY. Spot checks will be done. Line will be randomly tested at the discretion of the committee. If the line breaks over 10kg an average of three tests will be taken. **No WET tests will be done.**

NUMBER OF RODS & ANGLERS

A maximum of two rods per angler in the water at any point in time. Max 6 Anglers per boat.

<u>BAIT</u>

All anglers to supply own bait. Live bait may not be kept alive for the next day. Dead Bait may be carried over. Fishing for bait, with daisy chains are permitted, however **No** fish whatsoever may be weighed caught on a daisy chains.

LAUNCHING

On confirmation of control boat at 6h00AM earliest. Weather and light permitting. Remember to complete the control board and take your ID Tag before launching. Heavy fines will be imposed for not adhering to this rule.

WEIGH IN

All fish, tags and all anglers must be present at the weigh in at the NHONGUANE LODGE Gantry at 15h20 daily **Note the committee reserves the right to alter times if it deems necessary.** It is compulsory to report any event that may result in a late return. Justified requests for extra time may be forwarded to the committee for their consideration except on the last day. Boats will be considered at weigh in once their ID tag is placed on the control board. Daily prize giving will be held within half an hour after the last fish is weighed for the day.

FINAL PRIZE GIVING

This will be held at $\underline{\text{NHONGUANE LODGE}}$ at 18h00 on the final day.

THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE THE TIMES

TAG AND RELEASE

All Billfish, Green Job Fish, King Fish, Amberjacks, Tropical Yellowtail and All Barracuda species must be released and photographed using Digital camera with date time, showing length with provided tape. If possible video clips showing release of each fish should be recorded. Any of these species brought to the gantry will result in disqualification of the entire team for that day. Dead fish to be left in the sea. Successful releases must be recorded on a release sheet with time of release length and anglers name. Billfish released must be photographed with bill in hand before releasing.

MINIMUM WEIGHTS & BAG LIMITS

- All Marlin T&R Only
- Sail Fish T&R Only
- All Spearfish T&R Only
- Broadbill T&R Only
- All Game Fish 5kg

Bag Limit 6 of a specie per boat per day

A PENALTY OF 10 POINTS PER FISH WILL BE LEVIED ON UNDER WEIGHT FISH BROUGHT TO THE GANTRY.

POINTS AND SCORING

- 1. 1 Point per kg to all fish weighed in over 5kg.
- 2. 1 Bonus point will be awarded for number of species 2 and more.
- 3. 5 Bonus points per fish weighed in more than 10kg per fish.
- 4. All Bill Fish must be released alive preferably.
- The following points will be awarded to released billfish with supporting photographic digital evidence of either tag inserted or bill in hand All Marlin 20pts

Sailfish	10pts
All Spear Fish	7.5pts
Broadbill	20pts

For Chris Hemsworth, a day by the water was a little too quiet. "What a magical place this was - not a soul in sight, or fish either, s-t loads of mosquitos though," read his caption.

Fishing is an astonishingly assessable recreational outdoor sport. When you're fishing, it does not matter how tall you are or how much you weigh. Neither are your age, social status, gender and physical fitness of importance. All it takes is some fishing equipment, a good strategy, and knowing some helpful techniques. The easy accessibility of fishing is one reason why more than 40 million people fish. However, the major reason why fishing is so popular is that is simply good for you. Not only does fishing help you to live a healthier, happier, and laid-back life but it also keeps you physically fit. Similarly, spending time in nature helps you in finding a balance to your busy day-to-day life. If you fish regularly, you know how rewarding and soothing fishing is.









Covering more than 70 percent of our planet, oceans are among the earth's most valuable natural resources. They govern the weather, clean the air, help feed the world, and provide a living for millions. They also are home to most of the life on earth, from microscopic algae to the blue whale, the largest animal on the planet. Yet we're bombarding them with pollution. By their very naturewith all streams flowing to rivers, all rivers leading to the sea-the oceans are the end point for so much of the pollution we produce on land, however far from the coasts we may be. And from dangerous carbon emissions to choking plastic to leaking oil to constant noise, the types of ocean pollution humans generate are vast. As a result, collectively, our impact on the seas is degrading their health at an alarming rate. Here are some ocean pollution facts that everyone on our blue planet ought to know.

Ocean Acidification

When we burn fossil fuels, we don't pollute just the air but the oceans, too. Indeed, today's seas absorb as much as a quarter of all man-made carbon emissions, which changes the pH of surface waters and leads to acidification. This problem is rapidly worsening—oceans are now acidifying faster than they have in some 300 million years. It's estimated that by the end of this century, if we keep pace with our current emissions practices, the surface waters of the ocean could be nearly 150 percent more acidic than they are now.

So what happens when the ocean's chemistry is knocked out of whack? Marine ecosystems—and the coastal economies that depend on them—go out of whack, too. Take reefs and shellfish, for starters. To build their shells and skeletons, creatures like mussels, clams, coral, and oysters require calcium carbonate (the same compound found in chalk and limestone). But the ocean's carbonate levels go down when acidity levels rise, threatening the survival of these animals. Bivalves are at the bottom of the food chain, so these effects ripple up to many fish, seabirds, and marine mammals. More-acidic waters also contribute to the bleaching of coral reefs and make it harder for some types of fish to sense predators and for others to hunt prey.

Ocean Pollution: The Dirty Facts

Trash in the Ocean

The majority of the garbage that enters the ocean each year is plastic—and here to stay. That's because unlike other trash, the single-use grocery bags, water bottles, drinking straws, and yogurt containers, among eight million metric tons of the plastic items we toss (instead of recycle), won't biodegrade. Instead, they can persist in the environment for a millennium, polluting our beaches, entangling marine life, and getting ingested by fish and seabirds.

Where does all this debris originate? While some is dumped directly into the seas, an estimated 80 percent of marine litter makes its way there gradually from landbased sources—including those far inland—via storm drains, sewers, and other routes. (An excellent reason why we should all reduce plastic pollution, no matter where we live.) Oil from boats, airplanes, cars, trucks, and even lawn mowers is also swimming in ocean waters. Chemical discharges from factories, raw sewage overflow from water treatment systems, and storm water and agricultural runoff add other forms of marinepoisoning pollutants to the toxic brew.

Ocean Pollution and You

The fate of our seas is not only up to the government or industry. Our individual, daily actions matter, too. You can start by reducing water pollution and runoff at home, being more mindful of your plastic consumption, or organizing a cleanup of your local waterway. You can also support the work of NRDC and other environmental advocacy groups as well as other businesses and organizations that work to preserve our coasts and waters.
